Guest Speaker – Thursday 11th October

On Thursday 11th October students will be off timetable during Period 2 to hear a talk from the Sir Mike Rake, former Chairman of the BT Group. Students need to make their way to the Main Hall at 10am and sit in their normal assembly seats.

Open Evening – Wednesday 17th October

On **Wednesday 17th October** the Year 6 Open Evening is taking place. Students may be asked by departments to help on the evening. Senior Prefects assisting that evening need to be in the Year 12 Study Centre at 5:30 and be in full dress-code. Thank you in advance for giving up your time to assist with the evening. As a result of the Open Evening there will be an early finish on Wednesday 17th October. Periods 1- 4 will run as normal. At 1:20 students will be dismissed.

Curriculum Days – Thursday & Friday 18th/19th October

Thursday 18th and Friday 19th October will be Curriculum Days. Therefore students are not required to attend school. The last day of term will therefore be Wednesday 17th October.

Signing In / Signing Out

Sixth Form students are permitted to leave the school site at lunchtime. Students must ensure they sign out when leaving. This is essential health and safety requirement. Year 12 & 13 Signing-Out Sheets are located in the Year 12 Study Centre and Sixth Form Common Room respectively. If a student arrives to school after 9:00am they are must sign in and advise the Sixth Form Office, likewise if they are leaving early they must advise the office and then sign out.

K+ Programme – King's College

The King's College K+ scheme is designed to help able students from certain backgrounds make successful applications to university. Students must have at least 8 GCSE's at grades 4-9/A*-C (including English and Maths), and within this a minimum of 5 grades 7-9's (A*- A) or above and be the first generation in their family to attend university.
