A2/AS Level Results Day – Thursday 18th August

Year 13 students will be able to collect their A Level results on **Thursday 18th August** from **7:30 am** in the **Refectory**. EU Referendum Vote

On **Wednesday 22nd June** the Upper School will hold a referendum on the UK's membership of the EU, a day before the country votes. During morning registration students will be required to go to their 'polling station' to cast their ballot. The results will be revealed during an assembly on Friday 24th June. Students need to register first in their form room and then go to vote at their 'polling station'. Students will vote in the following locations:

Main Hall: 12T / 12X / 12W Common Room: 12P / 12Q / 12R Refectory: 12S / 12Y / 12V

Students should wait in their polling station until 9 before proceeding to Period 1 as normal.

Year 12 Students Considering Studying Medicine / Dentistry / Veterinary

UKCAT Test – Students applying to studying medicine may be required to sit the UK Clinical Aptitude Test. Applications are made directly by the student online at www.ukcat.ac.uk.

Applications can be made anytime between 1st May 2016 and 22nd September 2016, with testing beginning from 1st July 2016. You will be able to book your test slot date when you register online. Students applying to study a medicine related degree at any of the institutions listed below are required to sit the UKCAT:

BMAT Test – Students studying medicine or veterinary medicine may be required to sit the Bio-Medical Admissions Test (BMAT). Those who need to take the BMAT exam need to inform the Exams Officer (Mrs. K Cole) by **Friday 16th September**, so that they are entered for the exam, which takes place on **Thursday 2nd November 2016**.
